It was a nice surprise to realize (once more!) that there are many **common elements** between greek and turkish civilization.

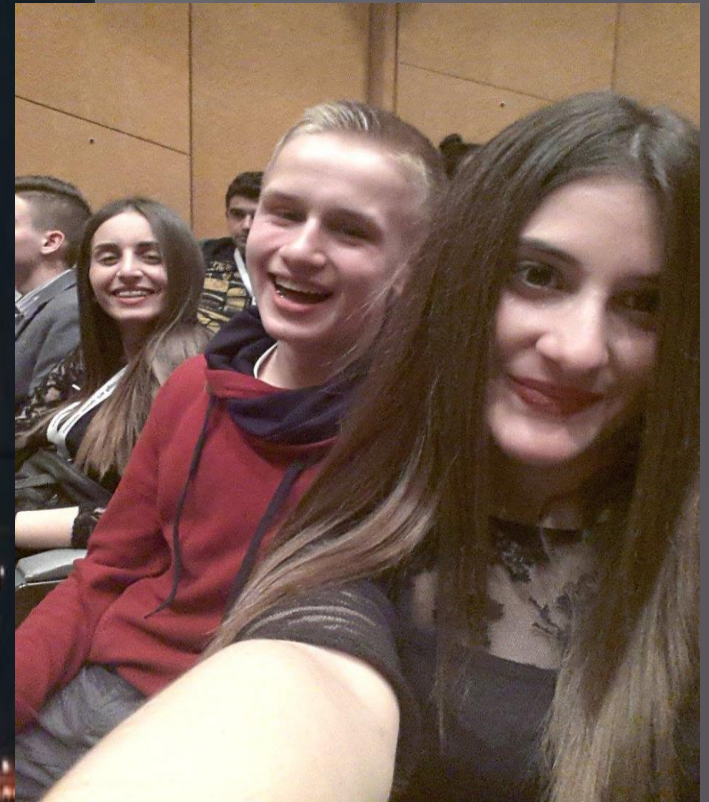
